After submitting this application to the Penn Township Office you will be contacted by a Cherished Cat Rescue Representative who will answer any questions you may have.

In exchange for our help you must agree to provide food and some kind of shelter and return these cats to the location where they were trapped.

You must bring cats in a humane trap/live trap to the clinic . These can be borrowed if needed. Please check one.

After submitting your application you will be contacted by a Cherished Cat Rescue representative to let you know that you have been approved for funding.

All cats must be brought in live traps if taken to the Danville SPCA Clinic even if they are friendly enough to handle.. Beckoning Cat Project accepts them in both traps and carriers regardless of temperament.

A few days before your appointment, put the cats' food inside the trap with the "safety lock" on the door so they become comfortable going in and out of the trap. One day before your appointment feed half rations in the morning. This will cause them to be hungry and hopefully encourage them to go in the trap when set in the evening before your appointment. Use canned cat food or tuna as a lure. Always put a pad of newspaper in the trap to keep them off the wire and to absorb any accidents. Do not cover the trap plate, however.

***DO NOT OPEN TRAP FOR ANY REASON. A CAT WHO ESCAPES A TRAP IS SELDOM CAUGHT AGAIN.**

After the cat is trapped, put it in a quiet area and completely cover the trap so they feel more secure and stay calm. WHEN SETTING TRAPS YOU MUST CHECK THEM EVERY HOUR AND AFTER CAT IS IN TRAP YOU MUST PROVIDE SHELTER AND PROTECT THEM AGAINST THE COLD AND HEAT. They will often be scared and bang around in the trap; using a sheet or blanket and putting them in a quiet area will help ease their anxiety and also protect from extreme temperatures.

When transporting the cats to your appointment put something waterproof between the trap and your car seat/floor. Try not to transport them in an open truck since this will scare them.

Female cats should be transferred into dog crates (or small rooms) to recover for at least 24 hours before being released. Provide them with a carrier to hide in, litter box and food and water. Male cats can usually be released later on the same evening unless there were complications OR THE OUTSIDE TEMPERATURES ARE TOO LOW. Cats must be returned to where they came from and have a feeder.
