

**TOWNSHIP OF PENN
SNYDER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA**

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-1

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SPEED LIMITS FOR MOTOR VEHICLES ON FAIR OAK ROAD WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF PENN, SNYDER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA FROM THE INTERSECTION OF FAIR OAK ROAD WITH SALEM ROAD IN THE TOWNSHIP WEST TO THE TOWNSHIP LINE.

WHEREAS, Fair Oak Road, from its intersection with Salem Road westerly to the Township line currently is subject to a forty-five (45) miles per hour speed limit; and

WHEREAS, the Penn Township Board of Supervisors, in order to advance the welfare and safety of the residents of the Township and such other persons who use said streets and roads, deems it necessary to reduce the speed limit on Fair Oak Road from its intersection with Salem Road westerly to the Township line; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors, after completing appropriate traffic studies on said road, find the following speed limit to be warranted in accordance with the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it is ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Penn, Snyder County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

1. The maximum speed limit in both directions for traffic traveling along Fair Oak Road from its intersection with Salem Road westerly to the Township line, and traveling from the Township line easterly to the intersection of Fair Oak Road with Salem Road, is hereby established at the rate of speed of forty (40) miles per hour.


2. This Ordinance shall be enforced in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania as it pertains to fines and penalties.

3. Should any provision of this Ordinance be found unconstitutional or otherwise illegal or in any other manner unenforceable, the remaining sections of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
