ORDINANCE NO. 2013- 01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENN, SNYDER COUNTY,
PENNSYLVANIA, TO WITHDRAW FROM THE SNYDER COUNTY
SEWAGE CODE ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, on August 4, 1981, the Township of Penn entered into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement to delegate and transfer to the Snyder County Sewage Code Enforcement Committee (hereinafter "Committee") all functions, powers or responsibilities of the Township of Penn, as provided for by the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, or hereafter amended; and


WHEREAS, pursuant to said Agreement, the Township of Penn is permitted to withdraw from the Committee by enacting an appropriate ordinance to that effect; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors have determined that it is necessary to withdraw from the Committee and to resume all functions, powers or responsibilities as provided for by the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, or hereinafter amended.


NOW, THEREFORE, the Township of Penn hereby adopts the following Ordinance withdrawing from the Snyder County Sewage Code Enforcement Committee.


